# 1. Executive Summary

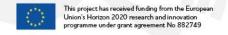
This deliverable presents the visual identity of the IcARUS project, which will be used for all forms of communication and promotional purposes.

# 2. IcARUS project overview

The project's main objective is to rethink and adapt existing tools and methods to help security actors better respond to security challenges in the context of:

- The decline of citizens' trust in institutions, local elected officials and other security and prevention actors;
- The consequences of drastic budgetary cuts affecting local and national authorities as well as various contemporary crises;
- The development of smart cities, which requires local authorities to become more efficient in their crime prevention policies, notably through the use of technological innovations.

The specific objectives of the project are to:

- Develop and deliver a global strategy for an integrated approach to urban security, that addresses the lack of a coordinated approach and that promotes a multi-level decision making process;
- Consolidate the knowledge and learning of the last 30 years and design modes of innovative delivery and stakeholder engagement that will unblock the traditional barriers to the implementation of urban security policies;
- Equip local practitioners with forward thinking solutions to understand mutations of delinquency and crime and better anticipate emerging security challenges.

IcARUS will focus on four areas that have been identified by local and regional authorities as their main security challenges:

- Preventing Juvenile Delinquency;
- Preventing Radicalisation;
- Preventing and Reducing Organised Crime and Trafficking;
- Managing and Securing Public Spaces.

They will also be examined in the light of 4 cross-thematic issues: governance and diversification of actors, cyber/tech, gender approaches and internalisation and cross border issues.

# 3. IcARUS: Visual Identity

The visual identity of a project consists of a set of elements that forms its graphic individuality.

For the IcARUS project, LOBA worked closely with the project's coordinator, in order to achieve an identity which aims at representing the project's complexity and various dimensions

#### 3.1. Logo

Firstly, LOBA introduced the project to its internal team, and as a result the designer thought out different versions of the project's logo, that can be seen in figure 1.

#### First Version

As a team, LOBA decided that the logo that should be presented to the project's coordinator was the one on the last line of the fourth column.

The inspiration behind this logo (up close on figure 2) was the connection between security (represented by the shield in the centre of the logo), the city (represented by the geometric contours of a city seen from above that surround the shield) and shared information (represented by the round shape of the logo – in the sense that everything is connected).

We have chosen the colours of the logo for the following reasons:

- Blue for security
- Purple for the logo's connection to technology.
- Second Version

While Efus, the project's coordinator, approved of the logo presented, they suggested that it could be made more visually similar to Efus' own logo. Indeed, as the coordinator aims at continuing the project's activities after its end, they wanted to have a proposal for a logo that could be associated with their organisation. Taking this into account, a new version of the logo was designed (Figure 3).

The coordinator opted for the first version of the logo (Figure 2). Moreover, Efus suggested to replace the shield in the middle of the logo with another shape, which could more clearly represent the social cohesion aspect of the project.

#### Third Version

We presented 4 versions of the logo (Figure 4), each of them focusing on specific colours present on the Efus logo.

LOBA also changed the shape in the middle of the logo, replacing the shield with a circle, to symbolize interconnectivity and team work, which is also reminiscent of the myth of IcARUS.

Based on all the options presented above (figure 4), it was decided that figure 5 would be the final logo of the project. This logo encompasses the urban (represented by the city), technological (represented by the colour gradient), and social cohesion (represented by the circle) dimensions of the project

This final logo was presented during the project's KoM. The consortium had a positive reaction to the logo and despite some discussion, there was a consensus around it.
